# BACK-GROUND

Architects 49 was established in 1983 by Nithi Sthapitanonda. From the beginning, his vision has always been timeless architecture with clean, simple, and elegant lines. With a keen interest in Thai art and architecture, our founder established the groundwork for present generations to follow. Our team has since expanded to more than 200 collaborators, working on projects around Asia and in the Middle East. Our diverse team enables us to create a broad range of architecture, from small scale residences to large scale mixed-use projects. We approach each project differently, with the belief that each one should have its own distinctive character.

A49 has delivered a number of well recognized projects including Prince Mahidol Hall, a concert hall for Mahidol University; BU Diamond for Bangkok University; a campus for Vistec in Rayong; ENCO complex for PTT Group; commercial projects for CPN, MQDC, King Power International and the Gaysorn Group's new Gaysorn Village. Our hospitality projects include the recently completed Hotel Indigo Bali Seminyak, Hua Hin Marriott Resort and Spa, Hotel Indigo Bangkok. Residential projects include Santiburi The Residences and several residential projects for Eastern Star, Ananda Development, and Charn Issara Development. Some of our on-going projects include One Bangkok and Dusit Central Park - two mega scale developments in central Bangkok.

In 2004, A49 established studios in Phuket and Chiang Mai, followed by another in Khon Kaen in 2015. Both Phuket and Chiang Mai studios have won several awards for projects such as Kelapa House on Koh Samui and Baan Sansai in Chiang Mai. A49 Khon Kaen, in particular, has a policy to employ local talent within the region. This has helped raise the bar of the architectural industry in Northeastern Thailand. They have recently completed their competition-winning design of Thailand Creative & Design Center (TCDC) Khon Kaen, which is due to open by early 2020. In addition, the three regional studios have collaborated with A49 in Bangkok on a number of projects including Sarnsara Academy Center in Ratchaburi, PTT LNG Headquarters in Rayong, and Renaissance Phuket Resort & Spa.

On the international front, A49 is currently working on a fourth project on the Palm Jumeirah with Nakheel; the first being Palm 360, a mixed-use development with a hotel and residence, which is currently under construction. Our project, the new Pullman Hotel in Hai Phong, Vietnam, is also under construction, while the Hotel Indigo Bali Seminyak in Indonesia recently won an award from Haute Grandeur Global. A49 is also working on a series of residential towers in the Luxe Lake new town development area in Chengdu.

# DESIGN PHILOSOPHY

The design concept of Architects 49 is to create buildings along clean simple elegant lines While the overall appearance must be attractive and inviting, the internal layout must be functional and practical so that the space is maximized and maintenance requirements are not complicated and economical. At the same time, each design has to be aesthetically pleasing to both the daily users and occasional visitors.

All of the projects—from large commercial buildings to private residences, reflect careful attention to detail in all aspects of design from conception to the selection of materials. Careful deliberation is given to the short and long term effects on the residents, the community, and the environment. These structures must assimilate gracefully with their surroundings, becoming an integral part of the context while maintaining their distinct and artistic appeal.

Motivated by this philosophy, Architects 49 is determined to maintain its high standard of design and production. The company regards its work as a labor of love through which it will continue to forge ties between designers, clients, users and the community.

# NITHI STHAPITANONDA

Founder

National Artist of Thailand In Architecture

Our founder, Nithi Sthapitanonda, an alumnus of Chulalongkorn University and University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign, founded Architects 49 in 1983. During his years at A49, he has held the position of President of the Association of Siamese Architects under Royal Patronage between 1992-1994 and the Secretary General for the Architect Council of Thailand from 2000-2002. In 2002, he received the honor of being named by the Ministry of Culture as a "National Artist" in Contemporary Architecture.

Nithi was appointed Honorary Member of the Japan Institute of Architects (JIA) in 1995 and Honorary Fellow of the American Institute of Architects (AIA) in the USA in 2008. In 2013, he received an Honorary Doctorate in Science in the field of Architecture from Sripatum University. Additionally, he has served on a number of boards and acted as a trustee for various organizations. Nithi has also chaired several judging committees for numerous prestigious awards, ranging from the Thai Ministry of Culture to Silpakorn University. A prolific master of drawing, Nithi has, over the past 40 years, collated a vast collection of his own ink drawings from his early school years onwards. He has developed a style and technique in pen and ink drawing that is well recognized among Thai architects and students. Approaching his retirement from A49, Nithi started Li-Zenn Publishing Limited, the publishing company of his dreams, and began to work on the design of religious buildings. Over the last ten years he has designed a number of wats (temples) and stupas, a few of which have received awards from the ASA. In undertaking such works, he has re-established a public interest in Thai religious architecture, long absent from local scene.



# PRABHAKORN VADANYAKUL

#### President / Managing Director

National Artist of Thailand In Architecture

Prabhakorn attained his Bachelor of Architecture degree from Chulalongkorn University in 1980. Following further studies at the Catholic University of America in Washington, DC, he graduated with a Master of Architecture degree in 1984. Prabhakorn then worked at Robert Schwinn & Associates in Maryland before returning to Thailand to join A49 in 1985. He has since been responsible for a wide range of projects from mega complexes and high-rise buildings, to private residences located in Thailand and the South East Asia region, namely China, Malaysia, Singapore and Vietnam. His work has also extended to the United Arab Emirates and India, adding breadth to A49's portfolio of work. Prabhakorn has been central in establishing major policies, design concepts and strategic planning initiatives for A49. He was appointed President of Architects 49 (Phuket) in 2005 and President of Architects 49 International in 2006.

Prabhakorn actively served as Head of Public Relations for the Association of Siamese Architects (ASA) from 1992 to 1994, its Vice President of Foreign Affairs from 1995 to 1997 as well as its President from 2002 to 2004. He has also contributed his experience to many subcommittees of both the ASA and the Architect Council of Thailand (ACT), and is an active Council Member of the ACT. Prabhakorn was also named an Honorary Member of the Japan Institute of Architects (JIA) in 2003.

Prabhakorn has been a key member of A49 since its foundation and entrusted by Nithi Sthapitanonda, the founder of Architects 49, to serve as the current President and Managing Director of 49Group.



SUWAT VASAPINYOKUL

Deputy Managing Director

Suwat Vasapinyokul graduated from Chulalongkorn University with a Bachelor of Architecture degree in 1983 and joined A49 as a founding member of staff. He has since been responsible for a large portfolio of architectural works, which includes a variety of building types, from private residences and apartment buildings to large office buildings and shopping complexes. Suwat pursued his postgraduate studies, outside of work, at Chulalongkorn University and attained a Master of Business Administration degree in 1992. He was promoted to a Director of A49 in 1990, and Vice President in 1992.

Suwat's expertise in business development and management led him to be appointed Managing Director of IA49, the interior design firm and an affiliated company to A49. After the re-structuring of A49 in 2001, Suwat became Chair of the Board of Directors, and has since been responsible for A49 business development and management policy.



# PICHAI WONGWAISAYAWAN

Deputy Managing Director

Pichai received his Bachelor of Architecture from Chulalongkorn University in 1985 and began his career at Architects 49. He pursued his Master's degree at the University of Michigan, graduating with distinction in 1989. Pichai then went on to work with the office of Hobbs & Black Associates in Ann Arbor, Michigan. He later moved to New York and worked with Hellmuth, Obata & Kassabaum for over two years as a designer.

In 1992, he rejoined Architects 49, taking on responsibility for large corporate and hospitality projects. Pichai was appointed Executive Director in 1995 and later promoted to Deputy Managing Director in 2001. He has been a major contributor to most international project opportunities that Architects 49 has been involved in. This led to the establishment of Architects 49 International in 2006, to meet the increasing demand for overseas projects, with Pichai being appointed as its Managing Director.

In his service to the profession, he has served as an active member of the Association of Siamese Architects under Royal Patronage (ASA) and was appointed as Vice President of ASA from 1999 to 2001, responsible for the Professional Practice Committee. He has also participated in many subcommittees for both the Architects' Council of Thailand and ASA, and was elected to serve as the President of ASA from 2014 to 2016. He was named Honorary Member of the Korean Institute of Registered Architects in 2014 and the Japan Institute of Architects in 2015.



# SOMKIAT LO-CHINDAPONG

Deputy Managing Director

Somkiat has extensive experience in office and residential building design. At A49, he has worked on major projects such as the Cementhai Building Product Center, the Tsunami Memorial and high-end residential buildings. Somkiat was also responsible for all overseas projects during his tenure at Architects 49 International, with a portfolio ranging from Abu Dhabi-Dubai to Kuala Lumpur. Somkiat taught at Silpakorn University from 1996 to 2003, and served as a member of the board of the Silpakorn University Alumni Association during 1999 and 2000.

He received a bachelor's degree from Silpakorn University in 1986 and attained a Master's degree from the University of California, Los Angeles (UCLA) in 1989. Nitis worked at the San Francisco office of Skidmore, Owings and Merrill LLP before joining A49 in 2003. Since then, Nitis has worked on a variety of projects, ranging from private residences and high-rise condominiums to resorts, and a university auditorium.

In 2006, Nitis was promoted to Deputy Managing Director of Architects 49 (Phuket), and Executive Director of Architects 49 in 2012. He has also served on the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Association of Siamese Architects since 2004.

**Executive Director** 


